2.2 Device

- Do not press the Power button on the device if the device is wet or do not touch adapter or power cord with wet hands. There is risk of electric shock.

2.3 Environment


2.6 Frequency Interference






Windows and Android devices are same except for the touch buttons on the front of the devices.

No.	Name	Description
0	Receiver	Allows user to hear the person they are talking to while on the phone.
2	Front camera	Takes selfies and records videos (1.3 Megapixel). You can use it when you have a video call.
₿	Charging LED	Indicates the status of the battery. The charging LED turns red when the battery is charging and turns green when the battery is fully charged.
4	Touchscreen	Displays apps and acts as a multi-touch interface.
6	Left button	Functions as the barcode scan button. You can also change the functions of the Left button. For more information, refer to <i>Button Setting on page 116</i> .
6	Volume up button	Turns the volume up.
7	Volume down button	Turns the volume down.
8	Search button	Searches for information online via Bing. If you tap and hold this button for a few seconds, the voice recognition service will launch.

3.2.2 Back




No.	Name	Description
0	Left battery lock	Locks the battery cover so that it does not become detached from the device.
2	Flash	Illuminates your surroundings when using the camera and related apps.
₿	Rear camera	Takes photos and record videos (13 Megapixel).
4	Handstrap hole	Secures the handstrap.
6	Right battery lock	Locks the battery cover so that it does not become detached from the device.
6	Battery cover	Protects the battery and inner part of the device.
7	Handstrap	Allows you to hold your device firmly.



3.2.3 Bottom and Top





- Primary microphone Captures sound for calling, video recording, and speech recognition.
- **5** Charging contacts Allows the device to be charged.



4.1 Cards

There are four slots for SAM, micro SD, and two micro SIM cards in the inner compartment on the back of your device.

- A SAM card is required for secured transactions that are made through your device. It validates the device and the credit cards. It also includes the company information.
- A micro SD card is required for external storage.
- A micro SIM card is required for using mobile services.




All cards should be purchased separately if necessary. The specifications may differ according to country where the device is purchased. Contact your sales representative for more information.

4.1.1 Installing the Cards

To insert the cards, the battery cover must be removed first. For information on how to remove the battery cover, refer to *Installing the Battery on page 13*. Before installing a card, make sure you are using the correct slot.


To insert the micro SIM cards

1 Slide the fastener downwards and lift it upwards for opening the slots.






2 Insert a micro SIM cards into the slots, aligning the cards with the slots. Make sure that the gold contacts on the cards are facing down.



3 Lift down and slide upwards the fasteners for locking the slot.




Using dual SIM cards allows you to choose between SIM cards for different mobile networks. Also, it allows you to use two independent mobile services, such as one for business calls and the other one is for personal calls.




To insert the SAM card

Align a SAM card with the slot. Make sure that the gold contacts on the card are facing down. Slide the card into the slot. It will click when it is properly inserted.




To insert the micro SD card


1 Slide the fastener to right and lift up the fastener for opening the slot.







2 Insert a micro SD card into the slot, aligning the card with the slot. Make sure that the gold contacts on the card are facing down.





3 Lift down the fasteners and slide it to left for locking the slot.





4.1.2 Removing the Cards

To remove the SAM card

- Push the inserted card once.
 The SAM card will release with a click sound.
- 2 Pull the card out to remove it.

To remove the micro SD and SIM cards

- 1 Slide the fasteners to unlock them.
- 2 Lift up the fasteners to open them.
- 3 Remove the cards and lift down the fasteners.
- 4 Slide the fasteners to lock them.




4.2 Battery


EF500/EF500R uses a 3,200 mAh Lithium-ion rechargeable battery. Install the provided battery before charging the device.

4.2.1 Installing the Battery

For the EF500 device, lift up the battery locks to unlock the battery cover.
 For the EF500R device, untie the handstrap and slide down the battery locks to unlock the battery cover.




2 Use the notch and lift the battery cover. Remove the cover completely.




- When removing the battery cover, be careful not to damage your fingernail.
 - Do not try to pull the battery cover excessively. It may damage the cover.



3 Insert the battery. Make sure the gold contacts are aligned.







4 Replace the cover.


For the EF500 device, insert the bottom of the cover first and then press around the edges of the cover until it clicks into place.

For the EF500R device, insert the top of the cover first and then press around the edges of the cover until it clicks into place.



5 For the EF500 device, close the battery locks to lock the battery cover. For the EF500R device, slide up the battery locks to lock the battery cover.








4.2.2 Removing the Battery

- 1 Remove the battery cover as described in *Installing the Battery on page 13*.
- 2 Use your fingernail to lift the battery out of the compartment as shown in the image below.



Before removing the battery, turn off the power. Failure to do so it may cause damage to the device.

4.2.3 Charging the Battery

The device can be charged with a charger or a cradle. You can also charge the battery by connecting it to your computer with the provided micro USB cable. Check the device's battery status on the status bar. You can also check the battery status on the lock screen.


- When the battery is low, the device will emit a sound and display a low power message.
- When the battery is charging, the charging LED will be red.
- When the battery is fully charged, the charging LED will be green.

Charge the device before using it for the first time or after not using it for a long time.



To charge with the charger

Plug the micro 5-pin end of the charger into the device's multi-purpose jack. Connect the micro USB cable of the charger with power adapter. Plug the charger into a power outlet.



When the battery is extremely low on power, the device may not turn on. Charge the device enough and try to turn it on again. You can use the device while charging. But it may take longer to fully charge the device.

- Connect the charger properly. Failure to do so may cause damage to the device.
- The device may heat up when charging. If it gets hotter than usual, stop charging.
- Do not remove the battery before disconnecting the charger. Doing so may cause damage to the device.

To charge with the cradle

Connect the power adapter with the cradle, and plug it into a power outlet.

You can also take out the battery from the device and charge it separately in a cradle.



4.2.4 Extending the Battery Life

You can improve the battery life in various ways. The easiest way is to use battery saver mode. When the device goes into battery saver mode, some background features and app settings may not function normally.

There are some other ways to improve your device's battery life.


- Always fully charge the battery.
- Mute unnecessary sounds, such as keypad sounds.
- Use a wired headset, rather than the loudspeaker.
- Close the Camera app whenever you have finished taking photos.
 - Tap the Back button \leftarrow on Windows devices.
 - Tap the Back button <a>
 On Android devices.
- Decrease the length of the screen time-out.
 - On the Apps screen, tap Settings > lock screen > Screen times out after and set a shorter duration on Windows device.
 - On the Home screen, tap || > 0 Display > Sleep and set a shorter duration on Android device.
- Lower the screen brightness.
 - On the Apps screen, tap Settings > brightness, and select a lower brightness on Windows device.
 - On the Home screen, tap (a) > (Display, and turn Adaptive brightness off, then tap the Brightness level to adjust the brightness level lower on Android device.
- Set your device to check for new mail less frequently, or even by request only.
 - On the Apps screen, tap Settings > email+accounts, tap an account, and then change the settings for Download new email on Windows device.
 - On the Home screen, tap (a) > Accounts > Google > and, tap an account, and then change the settings for Google on Android device.
- Disable Bluetooth when you are not using it.
- Use a Wi-Fi connection to connect to the Internet, rather than a mobile data connection.
- Prevent your device from scanning for available wireless networks.
 - On the Apps screen, tap Settings > Wi-Fi and switch Wi-Fi networking to Off on Windows device.
 - On the Home screen, tap $i \otimes i > i \otimes i$ witch the Wi-Fi to Off on Android device.




This chapter explains the basics of how to use your Windows device. If you are an Android device user, refer to *Basics (for Android) on page 30*.

5.1 Turning the Device On and Off

To turn on the device, press and hold the Power button for a few seconds.



To turn off the device, press and hold the Power button for a few seconds, and then drag the **"slide down to power off"** message downward.



- To turn the screen on or off, press the Power button.
- Registering the accounts without turning on the Wi-Fi may incur extra charges depending on your data plan.

Do not turn off the device by removing the battery, as this may damage the device.



5.1.1 Using Airplane Mode

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **airplane mode** and switch **Status** to **On**. This feature disables all wireless and mobile services. Repeat the step to deactivate Airplane mode.



You can set the Wi-Fi and Airplane mode on the quick action center. Drag your finger downward from the top of the screen at any time from any menu or app and tap the **WI-FI** button or **AIRPLANE MODE** button.

5.1.2 Using the Hot Swap Function

The Hot swap function refers to changing the device's components without shutting down the system.

1 Remove the battery cover.

The screen will be turned off automatically.

- 2 Replace the battery with charged one.
- 3 Insert the battery cover and lock it to attach the device.
- 4 Press the Power button to turn on the screen.

After swapping the battery, you should insert and lock the battery cover. If not, the screen will not be turned on.

5.2 Resetting the Device

If your device does not work properly or freezes due to unknown errors, you can force the device to restart.

To reset the device's hardware

- 1 Press the Volume down button while the device is turning on.
- 2 Press the Volume up > Volume down > Power button in order.

The device will restart automatically with reset setting 6 minutes after the toothed wheel screen appears.

The data on the device is keep saved when you perform the hardware reset.

To reset the device's software

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **about** > **reset your phone**. All settings and data, including apps and personal content, will initialize, and the factory settings will be restored.

- Reset the device whose battery is charged enough not to make the device turn off suddenly during resetting. You can reset the device, charging the battery with micro USB cable when the device has low battery power.
 - Back up any data and settings you want to keep before resetting the device to the factory default settings.



5.3 Using the Touchscreen

Use finger gestures to use the touchscreen effectively.

- Do not touch the screen with any sharp objects.
 - Do not apply too much pressure to the touchscreen.


Gesture	Name	Description
	Тар	Briefly touch an item to open, launch, or select it.
	Zoom in or out	Place two fingers on the screen and spread them apart to zoom in. Pull the fingers together to zoom out. You can also double- tap the screen quickly to zoom in or out.
	Tap and hold	Touch an item or the screen for a few seconds to access more detailed menus or options.
	Swipe	Touch the screen and quickly flick in any direction to scroll through menus or pages.
	Drag	Touch an item or the screen for a few seconds and move your finger around the screen to move the item or move through screens.



5.4 Locking and Unlocking the Device

Lock the screen to protect your device and its data.

The device locks if it is not in use for a specified period by default. To unlock the device, press the Power button to turn on the screen and drag upward from the bottom of the screen.



You can increase security by creating a password and screen lock timeout. For more information about how to configure and change screen lock settings, refer to *Lock Screen on page 106*.



5.5 Using the Start Screen

The Start screen is where you open apps and utilities. It is filled with Live Tiles that display real time notifications and updates.



No.	Name	Description
0	Status bar	Displays the status icons, notification icons, and current time.
2	Live tiles	Displays the some apps in your device. You can add, remove, or edit these tiles. For more information, refer to <i>Customizing Your Start Screen on page 25</i> .

The Start screen has long pages. To view other section of the start screen, swipe your finger up or down. You can add or delete contacts, apps, feeds, mailboxes, websites, and other favorites as tiles on the Start screen. You can also rearrange or resize the tiles. For more information about personalizing the Start screen, refer to *Customizing Your Start Screen on page 25*.

- To return to the Start screen, tap the Start button ╉ at any time from any menu or app.



5.5.1 Viewing the Status Bar

The status bar appears at the top of the screen. It displays the status icons and the current time on the right, and the notification icons on the left.

5.6 Customizing Your Start Screen

You can customize the Start screen by rearranging tiles, resizing tiles, and changing the background.

5.6.1 Adding Tiles

The tiles allow you to launch an app or activate a feature quickly. They also allow you to see updates at a glance without opening them. Tap and hold any of the following items, then **pin to start** appears. If you want to add the selected item as a tile on the Start screen, tap **pin to start**.

- Apps or games from the Apps screen
- Contacts or groups
- Favorite photos and music albums
- Favorite websites
- Email folders
- Map locations
- Office files

If you want to add a favorite websites as a tile on the Start screen, tap \dots > pin to start.

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **start+theme** and activate **Show more Tiles** to add more tiles. For more information, refer to *Start Screen and Theme on page 105*.

5.6.2 Arranging Tiles

Tap and hold the tile you want to move until it comes to the foreground. Drag the tile to a new location and tap the Start button **H**.

5.6.3 Resizing Tiles

Tap and hold the tile you want to change the size until it comes to the foreground. Tap the reduction icon or expansion icon until the tile changes to the size you want and tap the Start button **H**. If the tile you selected is already large, reduction icon **R** appears and if the tile you selected is already small, expansion icon **N** appears.

5.6.4 Removing Tiles

Tap and hold the tile you want to remove from the Start screen and tap the unpin icon 🐼. If you unpin a tile from the Start screen, the tile will be removed from the Start screen but will still be available on the Apps screen.



5.7 Using Your Device with Ease


Make it easier to see, hear, and use the device with its built-in accessibility features.

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **ease of access** and make the text size bigger, set a high-contrast theme, zoom in on the screen, and more to fit your individual needs. For more information on configuring ease of access settings, refer to *Ease of Access on page 113*.

5.7.1 Quick Actions

Access the most frequently used settings quickly with quick action, turning them on or off in an instance.

1 Drag down from the top of the screen at any time from any menu or app and tap a quick action button to turn it on or off.



2 Drag up from the bottom of the screen or tap the Start button **■** or Back button **←** to close the action center.

To change quick actions

- 1 On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **notifications+actions** and tap any quick action.
- 2 Tap a setting or action from the list to add.
- 3 Tap the Start button **H** to save the setting.



5.7.2 Setting Date and Time

The date and time are automatically set based on the network you are connected to.

To set the date and time manually

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **date+time** and disable **Set date and time automatically**. If you disable this option, the options for setting date and time will be activated. Tap **Time zone**, **Date**, and **Time** to set the current date and time.

To set the date and time automatically

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **date+time** and enable **Set date and time automatically**.

To change the time format

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **date+time** and enable or disable the **24-hour clock**.

5.7.3 Setting the Keyboard and Language

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **keyboard** or **language** > **add keyboards** or **add languages** and select the languages you want to use on the device.

5.7.4 Adjusting the Screen Brightness

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **brightness** and select **low**, **medium**, or **high**.

5.8 Connectivity

Connect to the Internet and other devices with various connection types.

5.8.1 Wi-Fi

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network is an easy way of accessing the Internet. When you are out, you can connect to Wi-Fi networks in public places, such as libraries or coffee shops.

- 1 On the Start screen, scroll down to the bottom of the Start screen, and tap All apps.
- 2 On the Apps screen, tap Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 3 Make sure to switch Wi-Fi networking to On.
- 4 Tap the network you want to join.
- 5 If necessary, enter the password for the network and tap done.

To close the connection, tap Wi-Fi and switch Wi-Fi networking to Off.

Your device periodically checks for and notifies you of available connections. The notification appears briefly at the top of the screen.

5.8.2 Bluetooth

You can connect wirelessly to various Bluetooth-compatible devices, such as phones, computers. You can also send your photos to Bluetooth-compatible phones or to your computer. On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **Bluetooth**.

Because devices with Bluetooth wireless technology communicate using radio waves, they do not need to have a direct line of sight. However, they must be within 10 meters (33 feet) of each other, although the connection may be subject to interference from obstructions such as walls or from other electronic devices.



- Paired devices can be connected to your device when Bluetooth turns on.
- Other devices can detect your device only if the Bluetooth settings view is open.



5 Basics (for Windows)



To pair with a Bluetooth device

Pair your device with Bluetooth compatible devices.

- 1 On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **Bluetooth**.
- 2 Switch Status to On.



• Make sure your other devices have Bluetooth enabled.

- 3 On the Bluetooth device list, tap the device name to pair with your device.
- 4 Type or confirm the PIN, and tap **done** or **ok**, if required.



• A PIN is only used when you connect to something for the first time.

When your device has paired with other devices via Bluetooth, your devices will automatically pair in the future when in range.

To unpair a Bluetooth device

Unpair your device with other device you paired.

- 1 On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **Bluetooth**.
- 2 Tap and hold a device's name to disconnect it.
- 3 Tap delete.

To send content via Bluetooth

Use Bluetooth to wirelessly share your photos or other content with Bluetooth-compatible devices or to your computer. You can use more than one Bluetooth connection at a time.


- 1 Pair your device with another Bluetooth device.
- 2 Tap the content you want to share, then tap \bigcirc > **Bluetooth**.
- 3 On the Bluetooth devices list, tap the device you want to share with.



This chapter explains the basics of how to use your Android device. If you are a Windows device user, refer to *Basics (for Windows) on page 18*.

6.1 Turning the Device On and Off

To turn on the device, press and hold the Power button for a few seconds.



To turn off the device, press and hold the Power button, then tap **Power off**.

- To turn the screen on or off, press the Power button.
- Registering the accounts without turning on the Wi-Fi may incur extra charges depending on your data plan.

Do not turn off the device by removing the battery, as this may damage the device.

6.1.1 Using Airplane Mode

On the Home screen, tap (a) > ••• More and turn Airplane mode on. This feature disables all wireless and mobile services. Repeat the step to deactivate Airplane mode.



You can activate Wi-Fi and Airplane mode from the quick action center. Drag down from the top of the screen at any time from any menu or app and tap the **Wi-Fi** button or **Airplane mode** button.

6.1.2 Using the Hot Swap Function

The Hot swap function refers to changing the device's components without shutting down the system.

1 Remove the battery cover.

The screen will be turned off automatically.

- 2 Replace the battery with charged one.
- 3 Insert the battery cover and lock it to attach the device.
- 4 Press the Power button to turn on the screen.

After swapping the battery, you should insert and lock the battery cover. If not, the screen will not be turned on.



6.2 Resetting the Device

If your device does not work properly or freezes due to unknown errors, you can force the device to restart.

To reset the device's hardware

- 1 Press the Volume down button while the device is turning on.
- 2 Press the Volume up > Volume down > Power button in order.

The device will restart automatically with reset setting 6 minutes after the toothed wheel screen appears.

The data on the device is keep saved when you perform the hardware reset.

To reset the device's software

On the Home screen, tap (a) > (A) Backup & reset > Factory data reset. All settings and data, including apps and personal content, will initialize, and the factory settings will be restored.

- Reset the device whose battery is charged enough not to make the device turn off suddenly during resetting. You can reset the device, charging the battery with micro USB cable when the device has low battery power.
 - Back up any data and settings you want to keep before resetting the device to the factory default settings.



6.3 Using the Touchscreen

Use finger gestures to use the touchscreen effectively.

Do not touch the screen with any sharp objects.
Do not apply too much pressure to the touchscreen.


Gesture	Name	Description
	Тар	Briefly touch an item to open, launch, or select it.
	Zoom in or out	Place two fingers on the screen and spread them apart to zoom in. Pull the fingers together to zoom out. You can also double- tap the screen quickly to zoom in or out.

6.4 Locking and Unlocking the Device

Lock the screen to protect your device and its data.

The device locks if it is not in use for a specified period by default. To unlock the device, press the Power button to turn on the screen and drag upward from the bottom of the screen.



You can increase security by creating a screen pattern, a PIN, or password. For more information about how to configure and change screen lock settings, refer to *Security on page 122*.



6.5 Using the Home Screen

The Home screen is the starting point for all apps and features. It displays icons, shortcuts, and widgets for apps.

The Home screen has multiple pages. To view other pages, swipe left or right. The white bar at the bottom of the Home screen indicates the current page you are viewing.

You can add or delete shortcuts, and widgets on the Home screen. You can also arrange the shortcuts and widgets. For more information about personalizing your Home screen, refer to *Customizing Your Home Screen on page 37*.



- To return to the Home screen, tap Home button \bigcirc at any time from any menu or app.
- To view the previously opened apps, tap Menu button 🗋 and swipe between the apps. Tap any app to open it again.



6.5.1 Viewing the Status Bar

The status bar appears at the top of the screen. It displays the status icons and the current time on the right, and the notification icons on the left.

- When the icons on the status bar are hidden, tap the status bar on the screen to display icons temporarily.
- The appearance of icons may vary depending on your region or network service provider.



6.6 Customizing Your Home Screen

You can customize the Home screen by adding shortcuts and widgets.

6.6.1 Adding Shortcuts or Widgets

Shortcuts added on the Home screen allows you to access and launch apps or activate a feature quickly and easily. Widgets appear as on-screen apps.

On the Home screen, tap to view your all apps under the **APPS** tab or all widgets under the **WIDGETS** tab. Locate an app or widget, and tap and hold the item until the Home screen appears. Position the item on the screen and release.



The same shortcuts or widgets can be added to any of the available screens.

6.6.2 Arranging Shortcuts or Widgets

Tap and hold the shortcut icon or widget you want to move. Drag the shortcut icon or widget to a new location. To place the item on a different page, drag it to the edge of the screen.



To change the size of your widget, tap and hold the widget on the Home screen. Release the item and a white box will be displayed around the widget. Drag the white dots to change the size. It is not available for some widgets.

6.6.3 Removing Shortcuts or Widgets

Tap and hold an shortcut icon or widget. Drag it to **X Remove** at the top of the screen. When the item turns red, release it.



6.7 Using Your Device with Ease


Make it easier to see, hear, and use the device with its built-in accessibility features.

On the Home screen, tap $\Rightarrow \uparrow Accessibility$ and make the text size bigger, increase text contrast, and more to fit your individual needs. For more information on configuring Accessibility settings, refer to Accessibility on page 125.

6.7.1 Quick Actions

Access the most frequently used settings quickly with quick action, turning them on or off in an instance.

1 Drag down from the top of the screen at any time from any app and tap a quick action button to turn it on or off.



2 Drag up from the bottom of the screen or tap the Back button \triangleleft .



6.7.2 Setting Date and Time

The date and time are automatically set based on the network you are connected to.

To set the date and time manually

On the Home screen, tap () > () Date & time, then disable Automatic date & time. If you turn off this option, the options for setting date and time will be activated.

To set the date and time automatically

On the Home screen, tap $i > \bigcirc$ Date & time, then enable Automatic date & time.

To set the date and time format

On the Home screen, tap $i > \bigcirc$ Date & time, then turn Use 24-hour format on or off.

6.7.3 Setting the Keyboard and Language

On the Home screen, tap \Rightarrow **\oplus Language & input** to change the language and the keyboard you use. For more information, refer to *Language and Input on page 124*.

6.7.4 Adjusting the Screen Brightness

- 1 On the Home screen, tap 🔯 > 🗘 Display > Brightness level.
- 2 Tap and move the slider to adjust the screen brightness.

6.8 Connectivity



6.8.1 Wi-Fi

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network is an easy way of accessing the Internet. When you are out, you can connect to Wi-Fi networks in public places, such as libraries or coffee shops.

- 1 On the Home screen, tap 💩 > 💎 Wi-Fi.
- 2 Make sure switch the Wi-Fi to **On**.
- 3 Tap the network you want to join.
- 4 If necessary, enter the password for the network and tap CONNECT.

To close the connection, switch the Wi-Fi to Off.



Your device periodically checks for and notifies you of available connections. The notification appears briefly at the top of the screen.

6.8.2 Bluetooth

You can connect wirelessly to various Bluetooth-compatible devices, such as phones, computers, headsets, and car kits. You can also send your photos to Bluetooth-compatible phones or to your computer. On the Home screen, tap 3 > 3 Bluetooth.

Because devices with Bluetooth wireless technology communicate using radio waves, they do not need to have a direct line of sight. However, they must be within 10 meters (33 feet) of each other, although the connection may be subject to interference from obstructions, such as walls or from other electronic devices.

• Paired devices can be connected to your device when Bluetooth turns on.

• Other devices can detect your device only if the Bluetooth settings view is open.



Do not accept the requests from unknown devices and also do not try to pair with an unknown devices. This helps to protect your device from harmful content.



To pair with a Bluetooth device

Pair your device with Bluetooth compatible devices.

- 1 On the Home screen, tap $1 \gg 3$ Bluetooth.
- 2 Turn the Bluetooth On.
 - Make sure the devices you want to pair with have Bluetooth enabled.
 - You may need to start the pairing process from the headset. For details, see your headset user guide.
- 3 On the Bluetooth device list, tap the device you want to pair with.
- 4 Type or confirm the PIN, and tap **PAIR**, if required.



- The passcode, which you can create, must be entered on both devices. The PIN in some devices is fixed. For details, see the user guide of the other device.
- A PIN is only used when you connect to something for the first time.

When your device has paired with other devices via Bluetooth, your devices will automatically pair in the future when in range.

To unpair a Bluetooth device

Unpair your device with other device you paired.

- 1 On the Home screen, tap $1 \gg 3$ Bluetooth.
- 2 Tap device's name to disconnect it.
- 3 Tap FORGET.

To send content via Bluetooth

Use Bluetooth to wirelessly share your photos or other content with Bluetooth-compatible devices or to your computer. You can use more than one Bluetooth connection at a time.

For example, while using a Bluetooth headset, you can still send things to another device.

- 1 Pair your device with another Bluetooth device.
- 2 Tap the content you want to share then tap $\langle \rangle$ > Bluetooth.
- 3 On the Bluetooth devices list, tap the device you want to share with.



7.1 Installing and Uninstalling Apps

You can purchase and download apps. On the Apps screen, tap **Store**.

7.1.1 Installing App

In the Store, browse apps by category or tap **2** to search for a keyword.

Select an app you want to install and see whether the app is free or not.

- To download a free app, tap **install**.
- To purchase and download a paid app, tap **buy** and follow the on-screen instructions.

To change the auto update setting, tap $\dots >$ settings and disable Update apps automatically.

7.1.2 Uninstalling App

On the Apps screen, tap and hold the app that you want to uninstall and tap **uninstall**.

7.3 Phone

7.3.1 Making Calls

On Start screen, tap **'**, or tap **Phone - SIM 1** or **Phone - SIM 2** on the Apps screen. You can simply dial a number, tap on a number in the history, or choose a number in your contacts.

Because the EF500/EF500R has two SIM cards, you can choose to use a SIM card based on your location or preference.

To make a call on the dialer screen

- 1 On the Start screen, tap ' or 代 .
- 2 Tap ()) on your Phone app.



3 Tap the keypad, enter a phone number, then tap call to call.




Touch and hold number 1 key to use voice mail.

Follow the instructions below to perform additional functions.

- Enter digits and tap **save** to save a new phone number in your Outlook contacts.
- Slide the bar located on the top right corner to 1 or 2 to select the SIM card you want to use for making calls.





7.3.2 Answering Calls

When you receive a phone call, the incoming call screen displays the caller ID, and any other available information, such as the caller's name, if saved in the Contacts list.

To silence the ringtone of an incoming call, press the volume down button on the side of the device.



7.3.3 Viewing Call History

To view the call log by incoming, outgoing, and missed calls or to clear the call history, tap '\ or '\ on the Start screen or tap the **Phone** - **SIM 1** or **Phone** - **SIM 2** on the Apps screen. The call history displays the dialed, missed, and received calls.

7.3.4 Making Emergency Calls

You can make emergency calls to 911 even when your phone is locked, not registered for mobile network service, or a SIM is not inserted. No charges for making emergency calls.



The emergency numbers may vary by country.

7.3.5 Making Speed Dial

You can make calls quickly without entering a phone numbers or searching for a contacts by saving your favorite numbers as a speed dial number.

To create a new speed dial

- 1 On the Start screen, tap 代 or 代
- 2 Swipe the screen on Phone app left or right until the **speed dial** tab appears.
- 3 Tap 🕂 and select a name you want to add as a speed dial number.

To edit speed dial

- 1 On the Start screen, tap 代 or 代
- 2 Swipe the screen on phone app left or right until the **speed dial** tab appears.
- 3 Tap ••• > edit.
- 4 Select the name you want to edit.

7.3.6 Call Settings

- 1 On the Start screen, tap ' or ' .
- 2 Tap ••• > settings on any tab of the Phone app. This SETTINGS can only be accessed through this app. You can modify various call options.
- **Text reply**: Switch the text reply to **On** to send a text message when you cannot answer a call. To edit the text message, tap **edit replies** and enter a message to send. You can create up to 4 messages.
- International assist: Activate this feature to correct some mistakes while dialing internationally or dialing while abroad.
- Switch to video calls with: You can turn a phone call into a video call using a video call app, such as Skype. If you have no related app, tap get an app to download the video call app.
- SIM 1 settings or SIM 2 settings: Configure the settings for two SIM cards.
 - My phone number: Check your phone number.
 - Voicemail number: Enter the voicemail number.
 - SIM security: Switch SIM security on when you want to protect your SIM card information.
 - Fixed Dialing (FDN): Use Fixed Dialing Number (FDN) to limit your phone to dialing only the phone number(s) or area code(s) saved in the FDN list.

7.3.7 Voicemail

1 On the Start screen, tap ' or '.

2 Tap on any tab of the Phone app.

You can listen to saved voicemail with this feature.

Register voicemail number first before using this feature.

7.3.8 Connecting or Disconnecting two Phones

- 1 On the Start screen, tap ' or ' .
- 2 Tap ••• on any tab of the Phone app.
- 3 Tap link tiles > link to have one Phone tile for two SIM cards.



Use the People app to create rooms and groups for privately sharing information or having chat. Also you can save, view, and edit your contacts.

Tap **People** on the Start screen or tap **People** on the Apps screen.

7.4.1 Making a Room or Group

You can create a room for privately sharing information, such as schedule, photos, etc. You can also have private conversations with invited people.

When you use this feature, making groups, you can easily check group member's SNS updates and text all members at the same time.

- 1 On the Start screen, tap People.
- 2 Tap **+** in the **ROOMS** and **GROUPS** tab.
- 3 Tap Room or Group.
- 4 Enter the name of room or group and tap **(**.
- 5 Tap **invite someone** for adding the person in the room.

7.4.2 Creating Contacts

You can add contacts and synchronize them with your accounts that support syncing contacts.

- 1 On the Start screen, tap People.
- 2 Swipe the screen on People app until the **CONTACTS** tab appears.
- 3 Tap \oplus and enter the information.
- 4 Tap 🕞 to save the contact.



7.4.3 Editing Contacts

To edit a contact details

- 1 On the Start screen, tap People
- 2 Swipe the screen on People app until the CONTACTS tab appears.
- 3 Tap the name of a contact to view their details and tap 🖉. Or, tab and hold the name of a contact and tap edit.
- 4 Tap 🕞 to save the modified information.

To set ringtone and text tone for a contact

- 1 On the Start screen, tap People.
- 2 Swipe the screen on People app until the **CONTACTS** tab appears.
- 3 Tap the name of a contact to view their details and tap 🖉. Or, tab and hold the name of a contact and tap edit.
- 4 Tap the **ringtone** or **text tone** to set each sound.

To place a contact on the Start screen

- 1 On the Start screen, tap People.
- 2 Swipe the screen on People app until the **CONTACTS** tab appears.
- 3 Tap the name of a contact to view their details.
- 4 Tap **⊘**. Or, tap and hold the name of a contact and tap **pin to start**. A tile for the contact will be created on the Start screen.

To delete a contact

- 1 On the Start screen, tap People.
- 2 Swipe the screen on People app until the **CONTACTS** tab appears.
- 3 Tap the name of a contact to view their details.
- 4 Tap ••• > delete. Or, tap and hold the name of a contact and delete.



7.4.4 Finding Contacts

You can search for contacts by name or number.

- 1 On the Start screen, tap Pupe.
- 2 Swipe the screen on People app until **CONTACTS** tab appears.
- 3 Tap 🕗.
- 4 Enter letters of their name or digits of their phone number.As you type, contacts that includes the letters or numbers will appear below the search box.
- 5 Tap the contact you are searching to view it.

7.4.5 Contact Settings

- 1 On the Start screen, tap People.
- 2 Tap ... > settings on any tab of the Phone app to specify various contact settings.
 - add contacts: Set up accounts or get the related app for adding contacts.
 - filter contact list: Specify display options by switching filter contacts on or off. If you activate this feature, you can only display contacts saved with phone number.
 - import from SIM: Import contacts from SIM cards.
 - Sort list by: Specify the method for sorting the list between First name and Last name.
 - Display names by: Specify the method for displaying the list between First Last and Last, First.
 - Use my location: Turn on this option to use your location for finding nearby places and check in.
 - Save check-in searches and locations with my Microsoft account to improve search results: Select the checkbox to improve search result with using the Microsoft account you registered.

7.4.6 Calling Contacts

- 1 On the Start screen, tap People.
- 2 Swipe the screen on People app until **CONTACTS** tab appears.
- 3 Tap the name of a contact to view their details.
- 4 Select the number and tap it.It calls the number at once. For more information, refer to *Making Calls on page 45*.

7.4.7 Messaging Contacts

- 1 On the Start screen, tap People.
- 2 Swipe the screen on People app until **CONTACTS** tab appears.
- 3 Tap the name of a contact to view their details.
- 4 Tap **text**. For more information about messaging, For more information on sending the messages, refer to *Messaging on page 55*.



Use the Messaging app to send or receive SMS and MMS messages.

Tap 🔯 or 🔯 on the Start screen or tap **Messaging** - **SIM 1** or **Messaging** - **SIM 2** on the Apps screen.

Because the EF500/EF500R has two SIM cards, you can choose to use a SIM card based on your location or preference.

7.5.1 Sending Messages

- 1 On the Start screen, tap 🙋 or 🙋 .
- 2 Tap 🕀.
- 3 Tap the **To** field and enter the recipient's phone number or name.
 - Tap 🕂 > choose a contact.
 - Type a recipient's name or phone number.
- 4 Tap and type the message contents in the message field.
 - To attach a file, tap 🕕. Select the files you want to attach, such as a picture, video, etc.
 - To use the speech recognition, tap **()**. Speak your message out loud to make your device input the sentence.
- 5 Tap 1 to send a message.

7.5.2 Finding Messages

- 1 On the Start screen, tap 🙋 or 🙋 .
- 2 Tap 🕗.
- 3 Enter the any key words that you want to search your messages for.

As you type, messages that includes the letters or numbers you entered will appear below the search box.



7.5.3 Deleting Messages

To delete messages

- 1 On the Start screen, tap 🙋 or 🙋 .
- 2 Tap a message thread from the list.
- 3 Tap and hold the message you want to delete and tap **delete**.

To delete message threads

- 1 On the Start screen, tap 😨 or 😨 .
- 2 Tap \cdots > (a) to select a message thread to delete.



8.3.5 Making Emergency Calls

You can make emergency calls to 911 even when your phone is locked, not registered for mobile network service, or a SIM is not inserted. No charges for making emergency calls.

- Teletypewriter or text telephone (TTY) mode is a telecommunications service that allows people with hearing problems, or speech or language disabilities, to send and receive text information over a telephone connection.



• The first time you open the Camera app, you are prompted to add location tag to the photos and display the information.

• If micro SD card is installed, the photos and videos will be saved on the internal storage.



8.8.1 Taking Photos

- 2 Aim the camera at the object. To zoom in or out, spread or pinch two fingers on the screen.
- 3 Tap to take a photo. You can hear a ding sound.

Your device automatically focuses on the object if the ZSL option is off and saves the photo on your internal storage.

4 Swipe the screen from the right edge to view the photos taken. To go back to the viewfinder, swipe the screen from the left edge.

8.8.2 Taking Photos in Panoramic Mode

The setting for taking panoramic photos are not available.

- 6 To view the recorded videos, swipe the screen from the right edge. To go back to the viewfinder, swipe the screen from the left edge.



8.8.4 Camera Settings

You can modify various camera options. This camera settings menu can only be accessed through this app.

- 1 On the Home screen, tap 00 > 00.
- 2 Tap the flash status icon on the bottom right of the screen, or tap and hold the viewfinder to change the camera settings.
 - Tap to enable the HDR feature, which takes multiple photos at different exposures and combines them into one vibrant photo. When you disable the HDR feature, the icon at the bottom right changes into .
 - If you want to turn off the HDR feature, tap us and the flash will operate automatically instead.
 - Tap \bigcirc to switch between the front and rear cameras.
 - Tap (0), (0) or (0) for more camera settings.
 - Scene mode: Tap to change the scene mode. You can select the mode among 19 modes.
 - **Store location**: Tap to select the checkbox to include location information for each photo using the device's GPS.
 - Picture size: Tap to select the size of photos in pixels.
 - **Histogram**: Tap to enable or disable the histogram. Histogram is a graph that shows the brightness distribution of a photo.
 - Picture quality: Tap to set the image quality. Higher quality images require more storage space.
 - ZSL: Tap to select the checkbox to turn on the ZSL option and to take a photo immediately after tapping
 When this option is not selected, the camera will bring an image into focus before capturing it.
 - Countdown timer: Tap to set the timer to take photos automatically without tapping O.
 - Beep during countdown: Tap to select the checkbox to set the beep sound while the timer counts down.
 - Continuous shot: Tap to select the checkbox to set continuous shooting mode to take multiple photos continuously by tapping and holding the .
 - AUTO HDR: Tap to enable or disable the auto HDR.
 - HDR need 1x frame: Tap to select the frame you used when you set the AUTO HDR in Enable. You can select False (single frame) or True (double frame).
 - Color effect: Tap to set the color effect for an image. You can select the effect among 10 effects.
 - Face Detection: Tap to select the checkbox to turn on or off the automatic face detection.
 - **Touch AF/AEC**: Tap to select the checkbox to set the touch AF/AEC. This allows you to set focus and exposure values when the focus and exposure area appears by tapping the viewfinder.
 - Selectable Zone Auto Focus: Tap to set a zone for auto focus.
 - Select Picture Format: Tap to select the photo format you want to save as.
 - Saturation: Tap to set the saturation level.
 - Contrast: Tap to set the contrast level.
 - **Sharpness**: Tap to set the sharpness level.



- Select Auto Exposure Mode: Tap to set how light values are calculated. Frame Average measures the entire frame. Center Weighted measures the light in the center of the scene. Spot Metering measures the light value at a specific location.
- Anti Banding: Tap to set the anti banding feature to decrease fluctuations in the brightness of images. Set to a higher frequency for more light oscillation.
- Select ISO: Tap to set the ISO number. Use a lower ISO number to make your camera less sensitive to light and use a higher ISO number to take a photo in dark conditions.
- Wavelet Denoise Mode: Tap to select the checkbox to remove the wavelet noise from images.
- Exposure: Tap to set the exposure value. Increasing the exposure value will double the amount of light captured by the camera and decreasing the exposure value will half the amount of light captured by the camera.
- White balance: Tap to select a suitable light source for your photo.
- Flash mode: Tap to enable or disable the flash or make flash operate automatically.
- Focus mode: Tap to select a focus mode appropriate for the photo.
- Redeye Reduction: Tap to reduce the red-eye effect in photos which often occurs when the flash is used in dark conditions.
- Manual Exposure: Tap to adjust the exposure value manually.
- Manual White balance: Tap to adjust the white balance value manually.
- Manual Focus: Tap to adjust the focus value manually.

In HDR mode, you cannot set the Continuous Shot, Color effect, Touch AF/AEC, Saturation, Contrast, Sharpness, Select Auto Exposure, Exposure, White balance, Flash mode and Focus mode.

 - Tap ① to switch between the front and rear cameras.
 - Tap (i) and (ii) for more video settings.
 - IS: Tap to select the checkbox to set digital image stabilization IS, which reduces blurring in a video by compensating for hand tremor and other movements.
 - Time lapse: Tap to turn the Time lapse feature on or off. Turn it on to set a time interval.
 - Video quality: Tap to set the video quality.
 - Video Encoder: Tap to set the video encoder. The EF500/EF500R supports MPEG4, H263, and H264 video playback.
 - Audio Encoder: Tap to set the audio encoder. The EF500/EF500R supports AMRNB and AAC audio formats.
 - Video duration: Tap to set the video duration.
 - Store location: Tap to select the checkbox to include location information for each video using the device's GPS.



- Color effect: Tap and set the color effect used in video.
- Video HDR: Tap to select the checkbox to turn on the HDR feature, which takes multiple videos at different exposures and combines them into one vibrant video.
- White balance: Tap to select the most suitable light source for your video.
- Video High FrameRate: Tap to select a high frame rate for your videos. Videos recorded with a higher frame rate capture movement more clearly.

9.4.2 Brightness

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **brightness**.

Tap Level drop-down list to adjust the brightness of the screen to low, medium, high.

9.4.3 Screen Rotation

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **screen rotation**.

Switch **Rotation lock** to **On** to fix the screen in the portrait orientation even if you rotate the device to the landscape orientation.

9.4.4 Project My Screen

- 3 Copy the image files with the .ffu file type to the root directory of the SD card.
- 4 Remove the SD card from your computer and insert it into your device. Then, turn the device on.

9.5.2 Language

 - **speech options**: Tap to configure the speech settings. This option is only available for languages that support the speech feature. For more information, refer to *Speech on page 114*.

You have to tap **restart phone** to change the language. The device turns off and reboots automatically.

9.5.3 Region

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **region**.

Use this setting to change the region in accordance with your current location.

- **Country/Region**: Tap to select the country.
- **Regional format**: Tap to select the language which is used in the selected country. If you select **match phone language**, the language specified in Language settings is applied.

- **check for updates**: Tap to check whether your device is up-to-date. After completion, a confirmation message will appear with the result.
- Automatically download updates if my data settings allow it: Select this checkbox to update your device automatically depending on data settings.
- Preferred install time: Tap to specify the time to install updates by tapping the hour, minute, and AM/PM.



9.9.1 Touch Setting

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > touch setting.

Tap Glove mode when you are using the device with gloves or Normal mode in according to your situation.

9.9.2 Button Setting

On the Apps screen, tap **Settings** > **button setting**.

Switch this option to **On** to detect your device's location.

On the Home screen, tap $i > \mathbf{Q}$ Location.

• Mode: Tap and select the method for determining your location such as GPS, Wi-Fi and cellular networks, or Qualcomm[®] IZat[™] hardware.

10.15 Security

Use this Security settings to set a lock screen and change settings to secure your device. On the Home screen, tap 3 > 2 Security.

Screen security

- Screen lock
 - None: The screen is unlocked at all times. When you press the Power button, the Home screen appears.
 - Swipe: Drag the lock icon to unlock the screen.
 - Pattern: Draw a pattern to unlock the screen.

Appendix C Troubleshooting



The battery does not charge properly.

- Ensure that your device and the charging cable are connected and the charging LED is functioning correctly.
- If the battery does not charge completely, it may be dead or defective. Replace the battery with a new one. (The warranty period for battery replacement is six months.)

The battery life got shorter.

When you use network data or peripheral device such as wireless LAN or Bluetooth that require more power, your device may use more battery than usual. If it happens for an extended period of time, your battery may be dead. Then replace it with a new battery.

I dropped the device in the water.

Turn off the device and take out the battery. Place the device and battery in a dry place. Let them dry completely for a considerable period of time, and then turn the device back on. If it does not turn back on, contact our service center.

My device gets too hot to touch.

It is normal for the device to warm up while it is receiving a poor signal, performing an intense workload, or charging. It should cool down if you stop using the device for a certain amount of time. If the problem continues, contact the manufacturer. It may result in a burst battery or fire.

How do I get the repair service?

You can contact your local sales representative or you can send the device via a delivery service to Bluebird's Korean headquarters. When sending the package, make sure you pay for the shipping fee in advance. When the repair is finished, Bluebird will cover the shipping cost.
