### **Battery Notice**

- 1. To guarantee optimal performance, it is recommended that rechargeable batteries be replaced every year, or after 500 charging cycles are completed. It is normal for the battery to balloon or expand after one year or 500 cycles. ### 1.4.2 Turning the device on and off

To turn on the device, firmly press and hold the bottom right [Power Button] until the boot screen appears. To turn off the device, firmly press and hold the [Power Button] to display the options menu. Select the Power off option to shutdown. With the device turned on, press the [Power Button] to turn off the screen and go into sleep mode; Press the [Power Button] again to wake the device, swipe upwards on the screen to unlock; If the device has been idle for a period of time, the screen will automatically turn off and go into sleep mode.

### **1.4.3 Charging the Battery**

Connect the cable and the device with USB type-c interface, and plug in the other end with adapter.

During normal charging, the home screen status bar will display the charging icon when screen is on. When the charging is completed, the home screen status bar will display the full battery icon when screen is on.

# Chapter 3 – Introduction to Applications

## 3.1 StageGO

StageGO is a configuration staging solution for unitech mobile devices. StageGO helps IT admins to use the 1-click auto configure feature to set up and initialize a device quickly. Devices configure themselves by using configuration scripts and barcodes prepared by the IT admins, the StageGO app, currently available for Android devices, uses unitech devices' barcode scanning capabilities to load the script barcode into the device and start the self-configuration process.

Using StageGO to configure a device is in 3 simple steps:

#### Step 1. Edit Script:

IT admins can prepare a configuration script by using StageGO's web-based script editor. The web-based script editor can be access by following this link: <a href="https://apps.ute.com/StageGO">https://apps.ute.com/StageGO</a>

#### Step 2. Print Barcodes:

Upon completion of editing a script, IT admins may either download the script file or to generate barcodes that represent the entire script. The script file or the barcode printouts can then be handed over to the device users for scanning.

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#### Step 3. Scan Barcodes:

When device users receive the barcode printouts (or the script file) from the IT admins, they can then run the StageGO app on their PA760, scan all the barcodes on the printouts (or load the script file). When all barcodes are scanned, StageGO is ready to begin self-configuration. StageGO can also be configured for 1-click auto configuration. On the main screen, scroll the screen
